Biography							
<p>Dr. Younsook Shin, Professor, Chonnam National University(CNU) in Gwangju, grew up in Korea and received her Bachelor's degree from the CNU in 1976. She had her Master's degrees from Textile Engineering Department, CNU. She received Ph.D. degree in Textile Science from University of Maryland at College Park in 1986. She has been teaching textile materials, dyeing and finishing, textile evaluation, etc. at Department of Clothing and Textiles in CNU. Her major concern in the development of eco-friendly dyeing process lead to research concentrating on biomass waste valorization for natural functional colorants and biotechnological method for indigo reduction dyeing. She served CNU, her Alma Mater, as the Dean of Planning and Coordination for the first woman faculty in the CNU history. As the President of Association of Women Professors of CNU (2011-2012), she implemented 'Stop the Tenure Clock' policy in the University Regulation for the events of childbirth, pregnancy, and child adoption for better professional development and work-home balance of woman professor. She has KWSE membership since 1993 and participates in KWSE Regional meeting and SSP program.</p>
